4. FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures

Eye Contact: Immediately flush eyes with water for at least 15 minutes, lifting lower and upper eyelids occasionally. Get immediate medical attention.

Inhalation: If symptomatic, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention immediately.

Ingestion: If swallowed, DO NOT induce vomiting. Give large quantities of water to dilute stomach contents. Call a physician or poison control center. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

Skin Contact: Flush skin with plenty of water and wash with a non-alkaline skin cleaner. Wash contaminated clothes before reuse. Get medical attention if irritation develops.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Extinguishing media

Nonflammable. Use any media applicable to the primary cause of the fire.

5.2 Special Hazards arising from substance or mixture

Fire or excessive heat may cause production of hazardous decomposition products.

5.3 Advise for firefighters

Concentrate: Wear NIOSH-approved self-contained breathing apparatus with full face piece operated in the pressure demand or other positive pressure mode and full protective clothing to prevent contact with skin and eyes.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Review safety precautions before proceeding with cleanup. Use appropriate personal protective equipment. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Ensure adequate ventilation. Stop the spillage. Dike the spill. Absorb spillage in inert material. Soak up with sawdust, sand, or other absorbent material. Remove non-usable solid material and/or contaminated soil for disposal in an approved and permitted landfill.

6.2 Environmental precautions

Prevent liquid from entering sewers, waterways or low areas. Discharge to sewer requires approval of permitting authority and may require pre-treatment. Contaminated surfaces should be cleaned using water.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Avoid breathing mist or vapor at concentrations greater than exposure levels. Use only with adequate ventilation. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Store in a cool, dry, well ventilated area. Keep containers closed. Do not store or consume food, drink, or tobacco where they may become contaminated with this material. Destroy contaminated leather items such as belt, shoes, and other items that cannot be decontaminated. Wash thoroughly after handling.

7.2 Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibles

Do not store with incompatible materials. Do not store with strong acids. Keep containers closed. All labeled precautions must be observed when handling, storing and transporting empty containers due to product residues. Triple rinse before disposal. Dispose of in a licensed facility.

Personal protective equipment

Eye Protection: Safety glasses with side shields (or goggles) with full face-shield where splashing of solutions are possible. Do not wear contact lenses when working with this substance.

Respiratory Protection: Under normal conditions of use, a respirator should not be required. If exposure limits are exceeded or if irritation is experienced, a NIOSH approved respirator should be worn. Normally, a NIOSH approved respirator for organic vapors is generally acceptable. Ventilation and other forms of engineering controls are often the preferred means for controlling chemical exposures.

Skin protection: Latex, rubber, or neoprene waterproof gloves are recommended.

Body protection: Rubber or plastic apron.
